



## Terms of Use Policy

The Commission on Fire Accreditation International (CFAI) accreditation model (encompassing categories, criteria, performance indicators, and core competencies) and process and Commission on Professional Credentialing (CPC) credentialing model (encompassing all technical competencies) and process constitute the intellectual property of the Center for Public Safety Excellence (CPSE).

CPSE holds the sole right to offer accreditation and credentialing based on the above-stated intellectual property and to develop derivative products, such as technical advising, educational offerings, and publications. At this time, CPSE through its technical advisor program, in-person and online educational offerings, and annual conference, is the only entity permitted to use CPSE's intellectual property and publications in its service delivery.
